


HYBRID PARKS

 With continuing urbanization, it is important to protect both biodiversity and cultural heritage as well as to ensure blue and green spaces for city dwellers.











Current problems of park zones

- There is a global trend to build more compact towns and cities, leaving less room for green urban areas.
- Regional cleavage and privatization (f.e. golf)
- Due to savings dishevelled or humdrum areas (mechanical treatment)
- Organizational changes
- In big cities slums and insecurity, the escape of the middle-class

Finnish National Urban Parks A Sustainable Approach to Urban Planning and Conservation

A national park may be established to protect and maintain:

- the beauty of the cultural and natural landscape,
- biodiversity,
- historical characteristics or other special townscapes,
- as well as the social or recreational values of an area within an urban environment.

- Network of N.U.P.s each has a special role












Pori National Urban Park
