




Coastline 130 km of which 30 km of beaches






The first detailed plans 1873 and 1878



The Purpose of the National Urban Park

- to preserve stories of history
- to make sure that the green areas are accessible to the citizens and other people for recreation even in the future
 draw attention to the values behind the idea of the National Park
- take care of Natura-protection (EU directives) areas in the archipelago round the Cape
- -fauna and flora of the Baltic Sea; with birds, plants of foreign origin/flowers, eg. orchids, rare insects, butterflies. Even the dunes and cliffs are unique in many ways.



The practical meanings / future

- -parks and recreation areas preserves free, as well as free shoreline zone
- -the living room for citizens
- -beaches are in a good condition and available to all
- -the diversity of nature is guaranteed and the ecologically vital corridors of plants and animals are reserved
- -face lifting of surroundings; are like visiting cards

The practical meanings / future

- -finishing and constructing; the route from the harbour/ the red warehouses to the House of the Four winds / for pedestrians and cyclists
- -a trump card for the tourism; tourist attraction
- -guide signs
- -the identity of local life has to be strengthened via taking out dimensions of historical events

- -making networks between the historical areas and the build and nature environments
- -(total) protection of the built environments and surroundings
- -protection marks in detailed plans
